the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert.


John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan,



Reflecting on Living the Gospel

Against a backdrop of geography, politics, and history, Luke ushers the adult John the Baptist onto the Jordan stage. Last Sunday's gospel announced the advent or "arrival" of Jesus at the end of human history; today, as watchman and awakener, John announces the advent of salvation and consolation to the people and proclaims that their hope for the dawn of messianic time is near. After four centuries of prophetic silence, in an insignificant and troublesome pocket of the Roman Empire, John heralds the coming of God's salvation not only to Israel, but to all humankind. He proclaims a baptism of repentance, a conversion of heart that looks to future commitment and not merely to regret for the past.

We are used to heavy earth-moving equipment and technology that builds roads to speed travelers on their way—smoothing treacherous bumps, straightening dangerous curves. Advent is the season of Christian "road work," with John the Baptist as our overseer. With John's voice, the church asks us both personally and communally to level and straighten out whatever is an obstacle or danger on our journey to God. What are the "potholes" in our discipleship, those sins of omission? From what do we need to be converted if we are to make the way smoother for others who find it difficult to travel to God because of our intolerant or erratic behavior? Do we indulge in outbursts of destructive "road rage" toward our sisters and brothers as we all try to follow the way of the gospel? Have we a kingdom vision that can enable us to see around the twists and turns of personal tragedy or ecclesial failure and to recognize there an advent of Christ—his presence with us in the suffering, dying, and rising from these painful realities?

Closing Prayer

Loving God, thank you for the gift of this day and the opportunity to grow in relationship with you. May we heed the forerunner's voice and redirect our thoughts and actions to you alone, ever smoothing the rough edges of our heart so that we might remain faithful to your Gospel and the way of life to which we are called. **Amen**.



For Reflection:

• Which paths in your own life might God be inviting you to straighten?

Suggestions for group and individual use:

- 1. Pray aloud the "Opening Prayer" (in *The Roman Missal* called the "collect").
- 2. One person read aloud the gospel.
- 3. Each read prayerfully "Reflecting on Living the Gospel" and spend some time in personal prayer.
- 4. Share together responses to "For Reflection."
- 5. Pray the "Closing Prayer."

We have received Updated COVID-19 Protocols for Church Activities from the Diocese.


For the Counties of O'ahu, Maui and Kaua'i: 100% church capacity is now allowed. Proof of vaccination is not required. No physical distance requirements.
